

## FREIRAUM / HOUSE RULES

The Freiraum is a space that is open for everyone and in which as many people as possible should feel welcome and as safe as possible. That means that the Freiraum and its team will not tolerate any transphobic, homophobic, racist, sexist, antisemitic or otherwise discriminating statements or behaviour. In the following you will find the rules that apply to the access to and use of the room:

1. Access to the Freiraum is free of charge for everyone. If you don't want to visit the exhibitions that require an admission fee but only the Freiraum and other areas of the museum that are free of charge (library and café), please ask for a Freiraum sticker at the ticket counter in the museum foyer and wear it on your clothing where our team can see it.
2. Eating cold food and food without a strong odour is permitted.
3. Cold and hot drinks may also be consumed within the room.
4. Restrooms and lockers are located in the basement of the museum for your use.
5. Luggage and personal belongings are generally permitted.
6. Taking photographs and making video or audio recordings is permitted in consultation with the team and respecting the personal privacy of every person pictured. Please be considerate and do not take any photos of people without their permission.
7. Please feel free to ask our team for help and assistance when needed concerning the access to and use of the room.
8. If you feel bothered, discriminated against or uncomfortable with a situation, please do not hesitate to talk to our team at the counter.
9. Smoking and the consumption of drugs and alcohol are not permitted in the Freiraum.
10. The terrace is part of the Freiraum, whereas the courtyard is not. Please stay on the terrace when stepping outside.
11. Children under the age of 8 may only stay in the Freiraum under the supervision of an adult. Chaperones of groups of children and adolescents are obligated to supervise the group and to make sure they respect the other guests and treat the furniture with care.
12. Please do not leave any stickers or tags in the room. We kindly ask you to treat the furnishings with care, out of solidarity with other guests and in the interests of sustainability.
13. The Freiraum may only be entered in clothing appropriate for public wear.

The general visitor regulations for the museum apply to any areas outside the Freiraum.
